ASHP Foundation Announces 2017 Recipients of the Pharmacy Resident Practice-Based Research Grants

BETHESDA, MD (June 2, 2017) — The ASHP Research and Education Foundation announced today that funding has been awarded to pharmacy resident researchers who hope to improve patient care by optimizing pharmacists' roles through the 2017 ASHP Foundation Pharmacy Resident Practice-Based Research Grant Program. The grantees will study critical healthcare issues such as pharmacist-driven inhaler optimization, opioid therapy, gaps in care in patients with type 2 diabetes, hepatitis C clinic care delivery models, and empathy towards patient weight loss.

This program, which is supported by the ASHP Foundation, supports quality research to advance pharmacy practice, encouraging practice-based research related to the ASHP/ASHP Foundation Practice Advancement Initiative (PAI) and Ambulatory PAI. The program also strives to develop pharmacy residents' research skills while encouraging mentoring relationships between new and experienced senior investigators.

"This program helps fulfill the Foundation's mission by supporting pharmacy practice research that, in addition to advancing pharmacy practice models, helps solve challenges that pharmacists face every day to ultimately improve patient outcomes," said Stephen J.
